



2012 Africa Child Survival Scorecard - Highlighting Malnutrition, Unsafe Water, Lack of Sanitation, Immunisation, & PMTCT

- **There is significant progress on reducing Child Mortality in Africa, but the continent still looses about 3.8 million children under 5 annually.**
- Globally, the main causes of under 5 mortality are pneumonia, diarrhoeal diseases, malaria, preterm birth complications, birth asphyxia, neonatal causes, a range of vaccine preventable diseases, and increasingly mother to child transmission of HIV.
- **The 50 worst countries globally for child survival include 42 out of Africa's 54 countries.**
- **❖** In most of these countries between 10% and 20% of children born die by their 5th birthday.
- Malnutrition is an underlying cause of more than a third of under-five deaths.
- **❖** In the 25 most affected countries between 23% and 58% of children suffer from stunting.
- In Sub-Saharan Africa, 1 in 8 children dies before age 5, over 20 times the average for industrialized countries (1 in 167) and South Asia (1 in 15).
- **❖** In the 25 most affected countries between 20% and 70% of the population have no access to improved drinking water sources.
- ❖ In the 25 most affected countries between 52% and 91% of the population have no access to improved sanitation facilities.
- ♦ Only 12 out of Africa's 54 countries finance between 50% and 100% of their Expanded Program on Immunisation.
- ❖ Increasing numbers young women of 15 years plus living with HIV mean that investment in Preventing Mother to Child Transmission is key to reducing Child Mortality.
- **!** Improved multisectoral Investment in non-health social determinant sectors impacting on health (alongside improved investment in the health sector) is key to improving child survival.
