## Summary Overview - with focus on State of Universal Primary Education

- > Investment in education is not keeping up with population growth.
- > There are an estimated 8.7 million children of school age out of school. (3.7 million male, and 4.9 million female)
- ➤ Net attendance rate for primary school in Nigeria (2014) was 68.70% a decrease from 71.00% in 2012.
- ► In 2014 Net enrolment in primary education was lowest in North West Nigeria (50.5%) and North East Nigeria (42.5%) Compared to South East (90.5%) South South (88.1%) South West (87%) and North Central (80.2%).
- ➤ Nigeria's school age population is estimated at 15.9 million for pre-primary; 27 million for primary.
- > Additionally secondary school population is estimated at 21.8 million; and tertiary population at 15.3 million

- In almost every North Eastern and North Western Nigerian state that borders Niger, Chad, and part of Cameroon the percentage of males over 6 years old that have no formal education whatsoever are in the clear majority ranging from Yobe 83% (North East), Borno 63.6% (North East), Kebbi 59.9% (North West), Sokoto 57.4% (North West), Zamfara 55.8% (North West), Katsina 54.8% (North West), Jigawa 54.7% (North West) along with Bauchi 51.5 (North East) and to a lesser extent Gombe 46.4% (North East) which are a bit further inland.
